MEXICO HAS A RICH HISTORY FILLED WITH THE STRUGGLE TO BECOME WHEREAS: A FREE AND INDEPENDENT NATION; AND

WHEREAS: IN 1810, Mexico won its first battle for independence against. SPAIN; AND

WHEREAS: IN 1862, Mexico won its final battle for independence against THE FRENCH AT THE BATTLE OF PUEBLA; AND

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. IN HONOR OF THIS HISTORIC DAY,

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TWENTY-SECOND DAY OF APRIL IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE. AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.
