



Proclamation

WHEREAS: MUSEUMS PLAY A SPECIAL ROLE IN PRESERVING OUR HERITAGE AND CREATING A SENSE OF CONTINUITY AND PRIDE; AND

WHEREAS: MUSEUMS ADD IMMEASURABLY TO THE QUALITY OF LIFE IN OUR STATE AND TO THE EDUCATION AND SENSITIVITY OF ALL MINNESOTANS; AND

WHEREAS: INTERESTED CITIZENS FROM AROUND OUR STATE, NATION AND WORLD HAVE JOINED TOGETHER FOR A SPECIAL TIME TO RECOGNIZE MUSEUMS AS A VEHICLE FOR INCREASING KNOWLEDGE, STIMULATING THOUGHTFUL INQUIRY AND ENHANCING CROSS-CULTURAL COMMUNICATION;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM MAY 18, 1981 TO BE
