WHEREAS: THE ANNUAL CELEBRATION OF NATIONAL TRANSPORTATION WEEK REMINDS THOUGHTFUL CITIZENS OF THE CONTRIBUTIONS OUR NATION'S TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM MAKES TO THEIR WELL-BEING; AND

WHEREAS: Women in railroading are important contributors to the successful operation of this industry; and

WHEREAS: THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF RAILWAY BUSINESS WOMEN, WITH ITS PROUD FIFTY-NINE YEAR HISTORY, HAS ENCOURAGED AND ASSISTED ITS MEMBERS IN THEIR EFFORTS TO SERVE THE NATION AS TRANSPORTATION PROFESSIONALS;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA,
DO HEREBY PROCLAIM MAY 13, 1981 TO BE

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE TASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I URGE CITIZENS TO BECOME MORE AWARE OF THE SIGNIFICANT EFFORTS OF WOMEN IN THE RAILROAD INDUSTRY.
