Each year the Lamar Fields located in East Cottage Grove are rented. by groups, teams, etc. to host weekend tournaments. At present, the City requires tournament hosts from Cottage Grove to pay \$10.00 per field per day and all out of area tournament hosts \$35.00 per field per day. In an effort to alleviate future maintenance problems and generate additional revenue, I would like to recommend the following policy changes for your consideration.

- 1. Request a \$50.00 damage deposit which would be refunded to the tournament host after an on-site inspection is made following tournament play.
- 2. Reduce the out of area tournament host fee from \$35.00 per field per day to \$20.00 per field per day. This action will:
 - a. Make it financially feasible for surrounding community teams to host tournaments in East Cottage Grove.
 - b. In-house teams will be playing in tournaments within their communities more often.
 - c. Additional funds would be generated and could be used for future improvements.

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These recommendations will be placed on the March 2, 1981 Parks Commission agenda for your consideration.
