WHEREAS: AMERICANS OF GERMANIC HERITAGE HAVE CONTRIBUTED IN GREAT MEASURE TO THE SETTLEMENT OF MINNESOTA AND THE BUILDING OF OUR GREAT STATE; AND

WHEREAS: AMERICANS OF GERMANIC ANCESTRY HAVE SERVED THE CAUSE OF FREEDOM IN OUR COUNTRY WITH GREAT DISTINCTION AND DEDICATION; AND

WHEREAS: THE CONTRIBUTIONS TO AMERICA FROM THOSE OF GERMAN ORIGIN ARE MANY AND CAN BE SEEN IN OUR CITIES, CLASSROOMS, BUSINESSES AND GOVERNMENT;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM JUNE 14, 1981 TO BE

GERMAN DAY

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I ENCOURAGE ALL CITIZENS TO REFLECT UPON THE MANIFOLD ADVANTAGES WE ENJOY DUE TO THE INFLUENCE OF THE MANY CULTURAL GROUPS WHICH SETTLED THIS STATE AND NATION.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TWENTY-NINTH DAY OF MAY IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THIRD.
