

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The people of Minnesota are proud and pleased to host members of the Sixth Procurement Mission from the Republic of China; and

WHEREAS: MINNESOTA'S CITIZENS AND LEADERS IN GOVERNMENT, BUSINESS AND AGRICULTURE COMMEND THESE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE REPUBLIC OF CHINA IN THEIR EFFORTS TO ACHIEVE AN EQUITABLE BALANCE OF TRADE BETWEEN THEIR NATION AND THE UNITED STATES; AND

WHEREAS: Minnesotans recognize that the exportation of agricultural products from the United States to the Republic of China is an important means to achieving this goal; and

WHEREAS: THE MINNESOTA DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, THE MINNESOTA DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND ASSOCIATED INDUSTRIES OF MINNESOTA, ARE WORKING TOGETHER TO BETTER ACQUAINT THESE HONORED GUESTS WITH THE WIDE VARIETY AND ABUNDANCE OF HIGH QUALITY AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS GROWN AND PROCESSED IN MINNESOTA;

NOW, THEREFORE, I. ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM MAY 15, 1981 TO BE

REPUBLIC OF CHINA DAY

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I EXTEND A WARM WELCOME TO THESE FRIENDS, WITH BEST WISHES FOR AN ENJOYABLE AND MEANINGFUL STAY IN MINNESOTA AND A SAFE JOURNEY HOME.
