WHEREAS: The Constitution of the United States of America gives us the foundation for a free, prosperous, and independent life for every citizen, and it is important that each generation work to strengthen and maintain the rights and liberties it provides; and

WHEREAS: It is of the greatest consequence that citizens fully understand the Constitution of the United States. In order that it be properly supported as "the greatest document for human liberty in two thousand years of recorded history"; and

WHEREAS: The people of the United States should be deeply grateful to the founders of our nation for the wisdom and foresight they displayed in writing and adopting the Constitution; and

WHEREAS: The independence granted to the American people should be celebrated by appropriate ceremonies and activities during the week of September 17 through 23, 1981, as designated by proclamation of the President of the United States in accordance with Public Law Number 915;

NOW, THEREFORE, I. ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF SEPTEMBER 17 THROUGH 23, 1981 TO BE
