



# Proclamation

WHEREAS: THE PRIVATE SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES OF ALL KINDS IS A ESSENTIAL PART OF THE AMERICAN SYSTEM OF VOLUNTARISM AND SELF-REGULATION; AND

WHEREAS: VOLUNTARY ARBITRATION OF CONTROVERSIES BETWEEN LABOR AND MANAGEMENT, AND BY COMPANIES AND INDIVIDUALS, SERVES THE PUBLIC INTEREST BY PREVENTING LOSS OF WAGES AND PROLONGED INTERRUPTION OF PRODUCTION, AND BY PROVIDING A PROMPT, ECONOMICAL AND EQUITABLE RESOLUTION OF DISPUTES IN A WIDE VARIETY OF FIELDS; AND

WHEREAS: PRIVATE VOLUNTARY ARBITRATION OF CONTROVERSIES CAN SUBSTANTIALLY RELIEVE THE COURTS OF THE BURDEN OF LITIGATION; AND

WHEREAS: THE AMERICAN ARBITRATION ASSOCIATION IS A PRINCIPAL ADMINISTRATOR OF BOTH COMMERCIAL AND LABOR ARBITRATION IN MINNESOTA AND THROUGHOUT THE NATION; AND

WHEREAS: THE AMERICAN ARBITRATION ASSOCIATION WILL MARK ITS 15TH ANNIVERSARY AT A LUNCHEON ON SEPTEMBER 23, 1981;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM SEPTEMBER 23, 1981 TO BE

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TWENTY-FOURTH DAY OF AUGUST IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE, AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THIRD.
