

Proclamation

WHEREAS: DECEMBER 7, 1981 WILL MARK THE 40TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ATTACK ON PEARL HARBOR; AND

WHEREAS: THIS ANNIVERSARY IS A REMINDER OF THE VIGILANCE AND PREPAREDNESS WHICH OUR NATION MUST MAINTAIN; AND

WHEREAS: WE OWE A GREAT DEBT TO THOSE MEMBERS OF OUR ARMED FORCES WHO LOST THEIR LIVES IN THAT ATTACK, AND ALSO TO THOSE WHO SURVIVED AND AIDED IN CARRYING OUT THEIR DUTIES TO THE ULTIMATE VICTORY;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM DECEMBER 7, 1981 TO BE

PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I CALL UPON ALL CITIZENS TO HONOR THE MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES FOR THE MANNER IN WHICH THEY BORE THE ATTACK ON THAT "DAY OF INFAMY" AND TO DEDICATE THEMSELVES ANEW TO THE VIGILANCE WHICH IS THE PRICE OF OUR LIBERTY.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS SEVENTH DAY OF AUGUST IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE, AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THIRD.
