WEREAS: ACTIVITIES IN SPORTS, SPEECH, MUSIC, DEBATE, THEATRE AND OTHER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES, PROVIDE A CONSTRUCTIVE OUTLET FOR THE ENERGIES AND CREATIVE TALENTS OF YOUNG PEOPLE; AND

WESREAS: Extracurricular activities extend opportunities for socialization and inveraction among high school students; and

HEREAS: High school activities directly benefit local communities by channeling the interests of young people in a positive manner; and
