AND INDEPENDENT LIFE, AND HIS CAPACITY TO BE PRODUCTIVELY EMPLOYED; AND

HREAS: THE WHITE CANE, BY ALLOWING BLIND PERSONS TO MOVE FREELY AND SAFELY FROM PLACE TO PLACE, MAKES IT POSSIBLE FOR HIM TO PARTICIPATE FULLY IN AND CONTRIBUTE TO OUR SOCIETY; AND

FREAS: EVERY CITIZEN SHOULD BE AWARE THAT THE LAW REQUIRES THAT MOTORISTS EXERCISE APPROPRIATE CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING A BLIND PERSON CARRYING A WHITE CANE; AND

EREAS: MINNESOTA LAW ENCOURAGES EMPLOYERS, BOTH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE, TO FULLY UTILIZE THE ALMOST UNLIMITED SKILL AND POTENTIAL OF OUR BLIND CITIZENS, WHILE REQUIRING THEM TO HIRE AND PROMOTE BLIND PERSONS ON AN EQUAL BASIS WITH THEIR SIGHTED COLLEAGUES; AND

SEREAS: THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, THROUGH ITS PUBLIC AGENCIES, AND WITH THE COOPERATIVE ASSISTANCE OF THE NATIONAL FEDERATION OF THE BLIND AND United Blind of Minnesota, can look forward to a continued expansion of Employment opportunities and greater acceptence of blind persons in the Complitive Labor Market;

MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO EFARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME, RIHER, I CALL UPON CITIZENS OF MINNESOTA TO RECOGNIZE THE WHITE CANE AS INSTRUMENT OF SAFETY AND SELF-HELP FOR BLIND PEDESTRIANS ON OUR STREETS AND HIGHWAYS,

WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT EAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS FIFTH DAY OF OCTOBER IN HE YEAR OF OUR LORD ON THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY ONE AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THIRD.
