

Proclamation

WHEREAS: In recent years, many individuals have urged that the fourth Sunday in October of each year be officially designated as Mother-in Law's Day; and

WHEREAS: Public opinion surveys have shown mothers-in-law to be highly regarded as an important figure in American family life; and

WHEREAS: Mothers-in-law have borne the indignity of countless jokes, and have continued to serve their families and communities in positive ways; and

WHEREAS: The United States Congress has passed a resolution establishing the fourth Sunday in October to be "Mother-in-Law's Day":

NOW, THEREFORE, I. ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO HEREBY PROCLAIM OCTOBER 25, 1981 TO BE

MOTHER-IN-LAW'S DAY

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME.
