

Proclamation

HEREAS: ALL AMERICANS HOLD FREEDOM AS A BIRTHRIGHT AND CHERISH IT AS A CONDITION OF OUR WAY OF LIFE; AND

HEREAS: THE FREEDOMS WE ENJOY WERE PRESERVED BY THE MANY GALLANT MEN AND WOMEN WHO HAVE SERVED IN OUR ARMED FORCES; AND

HEREAS: THERE ARE 480,000 LIVING VETERANS IN THE STATE OF MINNESOTA WHO ANSWERED THE CALL TO SERVICE OF THEIR COUNTRY IN TIME OF NATIONAL PERIL; AND

HEREAS: THE SERVICES PERFORMED AS A DUTY OF CITIZENSHIP PRESERVED OUR FREEDOMS AS AMERICANS FROM THOSE WHO WOULD USE FORCE TO SUBJUGATE THIS NATION AND ITS PEOPLE TO A FOREIGN IDEOLOGY; AND

THEREAS: IT IS FITTING AND PROPER THAT A DAY BE SET ASIDE TO RECOGNIZE THAT SERVICE AND DEDICATION AND TO HONOR OUR VETERANS IN MINNESOTA;

TOW, THEREFORE, I. ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA,
DO HEREBY PROCLAIM NOVEMBER 11, 1981 TO BE

VETERANS DAY

MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO REPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME.

JRTHER, I ASK THAT THIS DAY BE OBSERVED WITH APPROPRIATE CEREMONIES IN ECOGNITION OF THOSE WHO SERVED OUR STATE AND NATION WITH HONOR DURING A TIME OF NATIONAL NEED.

WITNESS WHEREOF. WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT EAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TWENTY-NINTH DAY OF OCTOBER IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE AND OF THE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THIRD.
