

To All To Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting:



THANKSGIVING DAY PROCLAMATION 1981

As Americans and as Minnesotans, we can be thankful for many blessings. Thanksgiving Day was first celebrated in this land not during a time of great prosperity and strength, but in times of adversity. The colonies of Massachusetts and Virginia had few material possessions to help them face the dangers of the wilderness. They had no certainty that the harvest for which they gave thanks would be sufficient to carry them through a long winter. Yet they gave thanks to God for what they had and for the hope that was in them.

The ensuing years have multiplied our Nation's blessings. We have been blessed with abundance beyond the imagining of those who offered thanks during that chilling winter more than three and one-half centuries ago.

Today we have good reasons for gratitude. We have liberty in a world where repression is common; we have peace in a world of war; we have a plentiful harvest in a world where hunger and despair still stalk much of mankind.

Minnesota is blessed with warm and giving people, tremendous beauty, and abundant natural resources. We are a state which has accomplished much, and we are still filled with great promise.

May we be thankful for all we have received; trusting not in our wealth and comforts, but in the strength of our purpose and our hope that all states and nations may be similarly blessed with liberty, abundance and a life of peace.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim November 26, 1981 to be THANKSGIVING DAY in Minnesota, and have asked Lt. Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same.
