- HEREAS: WE IN AMERICA ARE BEGINNING THE THIRD CENTURY OF THIS NATION; AND WE CAN SEEK NO GREATER OR MORE RELIABLE GUIDANCE THAN KNOWLEDGE OF OUR COUNTRY'S PAST; AND
- HEREAS: OUR HISTORY, WHICH HAS AMAZED MEN FOR MORE THAN 200 YEARS, IS A RECORD OF PEOPLE, OFTEN PERSECUTED AND DENIED, WHO FOUGHT FOR THE FREEDOM IN WHICH THEY BELIEVED; AND
- HEREAS: THE FREEDOMS THEY WON ARE STILL BESET BY DANGERS AND TO SUCCESSFULLY DEFEND THEM WE NEED THE INSPIRATION OF OUR FOUNDING FATHERS AND AN APPRECIATION OF THEIR SACRIFICES; AND
- HEREAS: THE EXPERIENCE OF THOSE WHO HAVE LIVED BEFORE US IS IMPORTANT TO THE SUCCESS OF EVERY ENDEAVOR AND PURPOSE WE UNDERTAKE; AND
- HEREAS: We must rely, to a great extent, on the lessons of history, whether our goal is to instruct or entertain, to increase needed production or facilitate the ways of commerce, to build cities or govern others, to explore uncharted space or establish a family:

N WITNESS WHEREOF. WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT EAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS FOURTEENTH DAY OF JANUARY IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-TWO. AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THIRD.
