



Proclamation

WHEREAS: THE "ENVIRONMENT, AGRIBUSINESS, RESOURCES, TECHNOLOGIES AND HORTICULTURE ASSOCIATION OF MINNESOTA" (EARTH) IS A STATEWIDE ORGANIZATION DEDICATED TOWARD THE DEVELOPMENT OF EACH STUDENT'S SOCIAL AND LEADERSHIP ABILITIES, AS WELL AS HIS/HER SKILLS; AND

WHEREAS: EARTH'S MAIN OBJECTIVES ARE TO PROVIDE OCCUPATIONAL EXPERIENCE PROGRAMS IN ALL PHASES OF THE AGRICULTURAL INDUSTRY, TO EMPHASIZE THE DEVELOPMENT OF LEADERSHIP, CITIZENSHIP, PERSONAL IMPROVEMENT AND OCCUPATIONAL RESPONSIBILITY; AND

WHEREAS: THERE IS A DEFINITE NEED FOR FURTHER EDUCATION IN AGRICULTURE AND AGRICULTURE RELATED FIELDS TO INSURE THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF ITS PEOPLE AND ECONOMIC GROWTH; AND

WHEREAS: EARTH IS MAKING CONTINUOUS CONTRIBUTIONS FOR ADVANCEMENT OF EDUCATION IN AGRICULTURE AND AGRICULTURE RELATED FIELDS TO ENSURE THE FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF PROFESSIONAL AND TECHNICAL GROWTH; AND

WHEREAS: THIS YEAR MARKS THE SEVENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE MINNESOTA EARTH ASSOCIATION, AN ORGANIZATION COMPOSED OF POST SECONDARY MEMBERS WITH THIS YEAR'S THEME BEING "EARTH AND YOU - GROWING TOGETHER";

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF FEBRUARY 14 THROUGH FEBRUARY 20, 1982 TO BE
