

## **Proclamation**

- WHEREAS: More than 78 million Americans are age 40 or older, and nearly 40 million are working or seeking work; and
- WHEREAS: Most of the middle-age and older workers are regularly employed.

  PRODUCING THE GOODS AND SERVICES OUR NATION NEEDS; AND
- WHEREAS: Despite high job qualifications, many who lost their jobs have great trouble finding new ones, and the search becomes more difficult as they grow older; and
- WHEREAS: During periods of unemployment, these workers experience personal hardships, disproportionate public expenditures for unemployment insurance, and lower productivity as our economy is deprived of highly experienced. workers; and
- WHEREAS: The federal government and the State of Minnesota are working to overcome widespread reluctance to hire older job seekers by making employers aware of each worker judged on the basis of individual ability to do a specific job:
