



Proclamation

WHEREAS: THERE REMAINS A GREAT NEED IN OUR SOCIETY TO COMPREHEND AND ABSORB THE UNIQUE QUALITIES OF CULTURE AND TRADITION OF THE NATIVE AMERICAN; AND

WHEREAS: WE APPRECIATE THE BEAUTY AND MYSTIQUE VISION OF INDIAN CULTURE AND TRADITIONAL CRAFTSMANSHIP HONORED BY THEIR UNCOMPROMISING QUALITIES AND INTERPRETATIONS; AND

WHEREAS: SOCIETY HAS ADOPTED THEIR MANY CONTRIBUTIONS IN OUR WAYS OF SCIENCE, MEDICINES, FOOD, CONSERVATIONISM, AND ARTISTIC QUALITIES; AND

WHEREAS: THERE REMAINS A GREAT NEED TO PROVIDE THE RECOGNITION OF THOSE SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS AND HOW THEY HAVE IMPACTED THE HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT OF OUR GREAT STATE OF MINNESOTA AND OUR SOCIETY; AND

WHEREAS: OPPORTUNITIES FOR EDUCATIONAL, AND CULTURAL EXCHANGES ARE ENHANCED BY ASSOCIATION PARTICIPATION AND GUIDANCE; AND

WHEREAS: MINNESOTA HAS PROMOTED, AND ENCOURAGED ACTIVITIES WHICH PROVIDE FOR A GREATER COMPREHENSION OF THE PRICELESS HERITAGE OF NATIVE AMERICANS TO SHARE THEIR CULTURE DURING INDIAN WEEK;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF MAY 1 THROUGH MAY 9, 1982 TO BE

INDIAN WEEK

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME;

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TWENTY-NINTH DAY OF APRIL IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-TWO AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THIRD.
