REORGANIZATION ORDER NO. 121

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1980, Section 16.125, the following administrative reorganization order is made with prior approval of the Governor.

In order to improve efficiency and avoid duplication in the operation of state government, responsibility for the accounting function and the funds of the Rural Rehabilitation Fund, which is controlled by the Governor's Council on Rural Development, are transferred from the Department of Administration to the Department of Energy, Planning, and Development.

No positions are transferred.

Equipment, records, and files shall be appropriately transferred as agreed by the involved agencies.

Any leases or other contractual agreements shall be amended to reflect the change in responsible agency.


The Commissioner of Finance shall make the necessary financial determinations in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 1980, Section 16.125, Subdivision 3.



REORGANIZATION ORDER NO. 120

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, 1980, Section 16.125, the following administrative reorganization order is made with prior approval of the Governor.

In order to improve efficiency and avoid duplication of effort in the operation of state government, the State Soil and Water Conservation Board, with all its powers, authorities, and funding is transferred from the Department of Natural Resources to the Department of Agriculture.

The following positions and incumbents, with all accrued benefits, are transferred from the Department of Natural Resources to the Department of Agriculture. The legislative complement of the Department of Natural Resources is decreased by sixteen positions and the legislative complement of the Department of Agriculture is increased by sixteen positions.
