WHEREAS: THERE WILL BE A LARGE NUMBER OF OUTDOORSMEN WHO TRAP FOR SPORT AND FOR PROFIT ATTENDING THE MINNESOTA TRAPPERS ASSOCIATION CONVENTION: AND

WHEREAS: 1982 IS THE TWENTY-THIRD ANNIVERSARY OF THE MINNESOTA TRAPPERS ASSOCIATION:

NOW. THEREFORE. I. ALBERT H. QUIE. GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA. DO HEREBY PROCLAIM AUGUST 14, 1982 TO BE

TRAPPERS DAY

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME, FURTHER, I URGE CITIZENS TO RECOGNIZE THE ASSOCIATION'S EFFORTS ON BEHALF OF WILDLIFE, THE SPORTSMAN AND THE FUR INDUSTRY.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF. WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS SIXTH DAY OF AUGUST IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-TWO AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FOURTH.
