WHEREAS: There are thousands of children and adults in the State of Minnesota with special learning disabilities; and

WHEREAS: THESE PERSONS ARE OF NORMAL INTELLIGENCE, BUT ARE HANDICAPPED BY A DISORDER IN ONE OR MORE OF THE BASIC LEARNING PATTERNS INVOLVED IN UNDERSTANDING OR IN USING LANGUAGE; AND

WHEREAS: THE MINNESOTA ASSOCIATION FOR CHILDREN WITH LEARNING DISABILITIES

IS A NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION DEDICATED TO THE ADVANCEMENT OF THE EDUCATION

AND GENERAL WELFARE OF THESE CHILDREN AND ADULTS; AND

WHEREAS: A STATE-WIDE CAMPAIGN TO INFORM THE PUBLIC ABOUT THIS SPECIAL PROBLEM HAS BEEN PLANNED FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do Hereby proclaim the month of November, 1982 to be

LEARNING DISABILITIES MONTH

IN MINNESOTA. FURTHER, I URGE CITIZENS TO ACKNOWLEDGE THIS TIME APPROPRIATELY.
