## RESOLUTION TO REORGANIZE THE TRIAL COURT OF THE TENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

WHEREAS the legislature has authorized the merger of the County Courts of a judicial district into the District Court,

AND WHEREAS it appears that such merger would be in the best interests of the citizens of the District and the efficient administration of justice therein,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the County Court Judges of the Tenth Judicial District, that one year following concurrence in this resolution by the District Court Judges of the Tenth Judicial District and certification of this resolution and such concurrence to the Secretary of State, the County Courts of the Tenth Judicial District shall be merged with the District Court of the Tenth Judicial District and thereafter constitute the general trial and probate court of such District, all pursuant to Minn. Stat. §487.91 (Chap. 398, Sec. 8, Laws of 1982), §2.722, Subd. 1 (Ch. 398, Sec. 1, Laws of 1982) and Ch. 398, Sec. 25, Laws of 1982 (approved March 12, 1982).
