WHEREAS: Two hundred and seven years ago, on November 10, 1775, the Continental Congress resolved that a Corps of Marines be raised to serve, and that they be distinguished by the name of American Marines; and

WHEREAS: Marines have long acquitted themselves with distinction and honor in war and peace as defenders of freedom the world over; and

WHEREAS: The sons and daughters of Minnesota, past and present, have contributed significantly to the proud record of the Corps; and

WHEREAS: It is fitting and appropriate that we recognize and remember the two hundred-seventh anniversary of the birth of the Marine Corps;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF NOVEMBER 5 THROUGH 12, 1982 TO BE

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF. WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TWENTY-SIXTH DAY OF OCTOBER IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-TWO AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FOURTH.
