WHEREAS: Charles A. Lindbergh was a Minnesotan who spent his boyhood years in Little Falls on the banks of the Mississippi River; and

WHEREAS: THE FAMED AVIATOR BEGAN HIS FLYING CAREER BARNSTORMING HIS JENNY AROUND THIS STATE; AND

WHEREAS: It is important for Minnesotans to commemorate the 60th anniversary of Lindbergh's life in aviation and his interest in the world environment; and

WHEREAS: Northwestern National Bank is presenting a spectacular exhibition, a Scandinavia Today event, in honor of this great Minnesotan and his Swedish Heritage; and
