TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF

The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent that they are legal voters residing with the territory in the County of Carlton, which it is proposed to incorporate as a village to be known as the Village of Wrenshall, which said territory is described as follows:

North half of Section Twenty-eight (28),
Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty-
nine (29), the East half (E $\frac{1}{2}$) of Section
Twenty (20), the West half of Northwest
Quarter (W $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$) and West half of South-
west Quarter (W $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty-
one (21) all in Township Forty-eight (48),
Range Sixteen (16), West of the 4th Prin-
