P E T I T I O N

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF  
CARLTON IN THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent that they are legal voters residing with the territory in the County of Carlton, which it is proposed to incorporate as a village to be known as the Village of Wrenshall, which said territory is described as follows:

North half of Section Twenty-eight (28), Northeast Quarter ( $NE\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Twenty-nine (29), the East half ( $E\frac{1}{2}$ ) of Section Twenty (20), the West half of Northwest Quarter ( $W\frac{1}{2}$  of  $NW\frac{1}{4}$ ) and West half of Southwest Quarter ( $W\frac{1}{2}$  of  $SW\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Twenty-one (21) all in Township Forty-eight (48), Range Sixteen (16), West of the 4th Principal Meridian in the County of Carlton and State of Minnesota, containing about Nine Hundred Sixty (960) acres.

That there are actually residing within said territory, One Hundred Eighty-two (182) residents and that none of said territory is in any incorporated village. That a part of said territory to-wit: The North half of North half of Southeast Quarter of Northeast Quarter ( $N\frac{1}{2}$  of  $N\frac{1}{2}$  of  $SE\frac{1}{4}$  of  $NE\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Twenty-nine (29), Township Forty-eight (48), Range Sixteen (16), West, has been platted into lots and blocks as Mainstreet plat of Wrenshall, Minnesota and said plat has been duly and legally certified according to the laws of this state and filed in the office of Register of Deeds for Carlton County in which said lands lie.
