WHEREAS: Minnesota's agricultural industry provides employment for 444,000 of the 1.7 million citizens in the state's labor force and generates \$4.9 billion of income; and

WHEREAS: There is an ever increasing need for well educated technicians, professional agriculturalists, entrepreneurs and leaders to service the agricultural industry; and

WHEREAS: Programs of Vocational Agricultural Education in 270 public high schools in Minnesota contribute to the education, training and motivation of future leaders in agriculture and agribusiness; and

WHEREAS: The Future Farmers of America, an integral part of the agricultural education process, challenges members to learn, to do, to earn, and to serve; and

WHEREAS: Michael Arends, Willmar, David Pace, Madelia, and Andrew Voxland, Kenyon National Proficiency Award winners in Agricultural Mechanics, Swine Production and Diversified Livestock Production and the Pipestone and LeRoy-Ostrander Chapter National Champions in the Farm Business Management and Agricultural Mechanics Contests, have demonstrated mastery of the competencies developed in their vocational agriculture/agribusiness education programs;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of February 19 through February 26, 1983 to be
