

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Printing opens and preserves the storehouse of knowledge and has contributed to progress since the invention of moveable type by Gutenberg in 1440 and has spread culture, knowledge, science, and advanced the cause of peace throughout the world; and

WHEREAS: Printing brings to us the wisdom and experience of past generations; the printed word provides continuity to life as it reveals past ages to the present and extends a hand to future generations who will learn about us through printed words, pictures and graphics; and

WHEREAS: Alive with the artistry and craftsmanship inspired by a remarkable and well-loved patriot, Benjamin Franklin, nearly two and one-half centuries ago, printing has flowered into one of the largest and strongest industries in America; and

WHEREAS: The International Association of Printing House Craftsmen, Inc., during the month of Benjamin Franklin's birthday each year, sponsors national observance of Printing Week, a celebration commemorating the printer in the United States, and supported in Minnesota by the Printing Industries of the Twin Cities, Twin Cities Club of Litho and Printing House Craftsmen, Graphics Now, In-Plant Printing Management Association, Minnesota Ad Federatio and the Minnesota Printing Trade Unions;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of January 23 to January 29, 1983 to be

PRINTING WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to give thought during this period to the great benefits enjoye by modern civilization through the invention and development of the art of printing.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this nineteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-three, and of the State the one hundred twenty-fifth.
