

Proclamation

- EAS: Sixty-five years ago, on January 22, 1918, a free and independent Ukrainian National Republic was proclaimed by the will of the Ukrainian people represented by the legally elected Ukraini Parliament in Kiev, ancient capital of Ukraine, which Republic was recognized by a score of foreign nations; and
- EAS: After such Declaration of Independence and recognition, Ukraine was occupied by Russian milit forces and since that time the former citizens of the Ukrainian National Republic have been living under the oppressive rule of Communist Russia, being denied the basic freedoms which linger in their hearts; and
- EAS: Their continuing struggle for freedom and independence is typical of the struggle of all free loving peoples everywhere and strongly emphasizes for us--free Americans--that the price of freedom is eternal vigilance against continuous encroachments, both at home and abroad, and especially against Communist aggression which seriously threatens the peace and security of t peoples of the world; and
- EAS: Americans have a traditional interest in the defense of freedom and human rights and sympathi with the aspirations of freedom-loving people wherever freedom is denied; and
- FAS: Minnesotans of Ukrainian descent annually observe the anniversary of the Ukrainian Declaration of Independence on January 22;

THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, Janua 1983 to be
