

## Proclamation


- WHEREAS: Of the nearly two billion acres of public land our federal government has held title to during our nation's history, approximately 740 million acres remain in the public domain and
- WHEREAS: These public lands encompass many of the most scenic and widely-used recreation areas in our nation; and
- WHEREAS: A vast wealth of minerals, fossil fuels, timber, and grazing acreage is contained there and
- WHEREAS: Many sections of our public lands provide essential habitat for the many species which comprise our country's rich wildlife heritage; and
- WHEREAS: There is an urgent need to help the public understand and appreciate the value of these national lands so that well-balanced plans to manage this important natural resource can be formulated; and
- WHEREAS: The period of March 20-26, 1983, has been set aside as a special time for focusing attention on the need to manage wisely and use properly these public lands for present and future generations of people and wildlife;


