



## Proclamation

WHEREAS: Motorcycle registrations number 159,000, and there are more than one-quarter million motorcycle drivers; and

WHEREAS: The number of motorcycle accidents has exceeded 3,000 a year; and

WHEREAS: The number of injuries in motorcycle-involved accidents has surpassed 3,000; and

WHEREAS: The number of deaths from motorcycle accidents is averaging near 100 per year; and

WHEREAS: Effective traffic safety requires the complete cooperation and understanding of drivers of all vehicles;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 24 through April 30, 1983, to be


### MOTORCYCLE SAFETY AWARENESS WEEK
