WHEREAS: Public television is committed to responding to Minnesota's special needs and interests; and


WHEREAS: Public television can provide program diversity not available on commercial television;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of March, 1983, to be
