

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Galtier Plaza begins its promise of benefits to the City of St. Paul in a unique mixeduse development offering housing, office, retail and entertainment opportunities to all residents of the city; we stop to honor the pioneer French priest who named the City of St. Paul; and

WHEREAS: Father Lucian Galtier became the first permanently assigned Catholic priest to minister to the soldiers and settlers around Fort Snelling; and

WHEREAS: He dedicated himself to the spiritual and social needs of our pioneer forefathers, relinquishing all comforts and living a life of hard trials and suffering; and

WHEREAS: His insight in choosing a location for the church, where steamboats could stop and the river could be easily crossed, led to increased trade and fast growth of the city; and

WHEREAS: The nucleous of St. Paul was formed when Galtier dedicated his church to the great apost St. Paul, whose motto was "When I am weak, then I am powerful"; and

WHEREAS: Father Galtier opposed an early effort made to change the name of St. Paul by writing from Prairie du Chien, where he was reassigned after his work in St. Paul; and

WHEREAS: On March 16, 1983, on the occasion of the official beginning of Galtier Plaza, an event will be held in honor of his important contributions to this historic site;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, March 16, 1983, to be

FATHER LUCIAN GALTIER DAY

in Minnesota.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fifteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-three, and of the State the or hundred twenty-fifth.
