WHEREAS: Danes are among the founding pioneers of Minnesota, and remain a vital part of many of our state's communities; and


WHEREAS: The annual Danish Day is not only a visible link for the Danish community, but a bridge of culture and link of understanding for all our citizens;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, June 5, 1983, to be
