



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Harrison E. Salisbury emerged from his native Minnesota to win national and international renown; and

WHEREAS: Harrison E. Salisbury began his professional career on the Minneapolis Journal, and later on the staff of the United Press in St. Paul, a position which took him to Arctic Siberia, Tibet, Mongolia, Russia during World War II, Hanoi behind the American lines during the Viet Nam conflict, and to the People's Republic of China; and

WHEREAS: His journalistic achievements include coverage of the greatest events of our time -- the Roosevelt New Deal, the Red Army's offensive against Hitler, the death of Josef Stalin, the assassination of Huey Long in Louisiana and other events; and

WHEREAS: Harrison E. Salisbury has covered the national political scene since 1932, the civil rights struggle in the South, and directed the coverage of the events surrounding the tragic assassination of President Kennedy; and

WHEREAS: He served as reporter and editor of the New York Times for twenty-five years and received the Pulitzer Prize for international reporting for his work as a Moscow correspondent; and

WHEREAS: Harrison E. Salisbury has received much acclaim and recognition for his efforts as a novelist and historian;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Monday, June 13, 1983 to be
