



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Each year, in Minnesota and across the nation, a day is set aside to recognize hunters and anglers for their efforts and contributions toward protecting and enhancing our natural resources; and

WHEREAS: These men and women were among the first environmentalists, having traditionally held strong opinions about clean air, good water, and a livable habitat for wildlife, and have been in the forefront of efforts to use our resources wisely, so that future generations also might enjoy and benefit from them; and

WHEREAS: Our State's fish and game laws were established through the efforts of persons who hunted and fished, and who recognized the need to preserve and protect the populations of species so that fish and game would continue to exist in harmony with nature and society; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota's anglers and hunters are justifiably proud of their heritage, recognizing the need to carry our State's fishing and hunting traditions;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim, Saturday September 24, 1983, to be

REORGANIZATION ORDER NO. 126

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 16.125, the following administrative reorganization is made with the prior approval of the Governor.

In order to improve efficiency and to avoid duplication in the operation of state government, certain powers and duties of the Department and Commissioner of Administration related to landscaping in the capitol complex are transferred to the Capitol Area Architectural Planning Board (the "Board") and Executive Director thereof as following described. Transferred are the following portions of the specific powers and duties described in Minnesota Laws 1983, Chapter 334, Section 2(e) and to the extent necessary those powers and duties necessary to effectuate the aforementioned.

Development of a master landscape plan for the state capitol area under the authority to Minnesota Statutes Section 15.50, to include:

- an inventory and analysis of existing site conditions
- a conceptual landscape program
- a master landscape program
- an implementation strategy

No positions are transferred.

Funds appropriated to the Department of Administration by Minnesota Laws 1983, Chapter 344, Section 2(e) in the amount of \$27,500 are transferred to the Board for the performance of the duties transferred, which amount has been determined by the Commissioner of Finance pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 16.125, subd. 3, as the fractional part of the appropriation to the Commissioner of Administration for the purposes of Minnesota Laws 1983, Chapter 344, Section 2(e) represented by the powers and duties transferred to the Board.

In accordance with Minnesota Statutes 1982, Section 16.125, this order is effective upon filing with the Secretary of State and shall remain in effect until amended or superseded.
