WHEREAS: Kiwanis International, a community service organization with 309,000 members in 8,000 clubs, raised \$35 million in cash and donated \$300 million in time this year

to 79 nations and geographic areas; and

WHEREAS: Kiwanis, organized in 1915 in Detroit, Michigan, is recognized as one of the world's largest community service organizations in the world; and

WHEREAS: The concept and principle Kiwanis represents is symbolized by the slogan, "We Build"; and

WHEREAS: The K-family includes two coed, youth affiliates. Circle K International has 12,000 college students in 800 clubs and Key Club International has 108,000 members in 3,500 high schools; and
