WHEREAS: The United States of America was founded on the principles of equality and justice for all people; and

WHEREAS: The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People is our country's largest and oldest civil rights organization dedicated to the realization of that principle; an

WHEREAS: For seventy-five years that NAACP has sustained its commitment to end racial discriminal in every aspect of American life; and

WHEREAS: More than any other non-governmental agency, the NAACP has been responsible for the progress made by black Americans and other minority groups in this century; and

WHEREAS: The NAACP works unremittingly to the achievement of those conditions of life, citizensh and human well-being guaranteed in the Constitution by our founding fathers; and

WHEREAS: Although great strides forward have been made during the past seventy-four years, for t many Americans, the goal of ending racial discrimination has yet to be achieved; and

WHEREAS: The NAACP membership of 400,000 is organized in each of the fifty states and comprise a economic levels and racial groups including our state of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: The NAACP has designed 1984 as its Diamond Jubilee Year; and

WHEREAS: February 12, 1984, marks the 75th Anniversary of the founding of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People;
