WHEREAS: The Minnesota Hospital Admitting Managers Association is participating in a national celebration honoring its members during the week of April 1, 1984; and

WHEREAS: The National Association of Hospital Admitting Managers (NAHAM) was formally organized on April 5, 1974, at Jamaica Hospital in New York City; and

WHEREAS: There are some 1,550 Hospital Admitting Managers in the nation, and they have contributed much to the improvement in procedures and the growth of service in U.S. hospitals; and
