



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Less than forty years ago, six million Jews were murdered in the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic program of genocide, and millions of other people suffered as victims of the Nazism; and
- WHEREAS: The people of the State of Minnesota should always remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such horrors never be repeated; and
- WHEREAS: The people of the State of Minnesota should continually rededicate themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and
- WHEREAS: The people of the State of Minnesota should remain eternally vigilant against all tyranny, and recognize that bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish;
- WHEREAS: April 29 has been designated pursuant to an Act of Congress and internationally as a Day of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust, known as Yom Hashoah; and
- WHEREAS: It is appropriate for the people of the State of Minnesota to join in the international commemoration;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 29 through May 6, 1984, to be
