The National Kidney Foundation of the Upper Midwest is working to alleviate this severe health problem through research, public and professional education, patient/community services and the "Gift of Life" Organ Donor Program in keeping with Minnesota's Uniform Anatomical Gift Act; and

WHEREAS:

The National Kidney Foundation of the Upper Midwest is continuing as extensive public education program, together with an Organ Donor campaign; and

The National Kidney Foundation has set a goal to have one million more Americans signand carry organ donor cards in 1984;
