- REAS: Serious crime continues to ravage at least one third of all American households each year; and
- REAS: The victims of crime often face serious financial, physical, and psychological losses;
- REAS: Traditionally such injuries have been ignored and witnessed have been treated like evidence rather than people; and
- REAS: Certain types of victims children, victims of family violence, minorities, and the poor have often suffered even more when they found that they had little access to the social service and criminal justice systems; and
- REAS: All citizens of the United States should have an equal opportunity to be treated with compassion, dignity and justice; and
- TREAS: Heretofore such treatment has not been afforded to all victims, witnesses, and their loved-ones or survivors;
- V, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of il 15 through April 21, 1984, to be

VICTIMS RIGHTS WEEK

Minnesota.
