WHEREAS: Workplace accidents each year kill about 11,000 Americans and injure an additional 2.1 million workers; and

WHEREAS: These accidents cost Americans about \$31 billion annually; and

WHEREAS: Employers and employees in the public and private sectors must recognize the need to safeguard the working place so that we may enjoy a productive and healthy environment; and

WHEREAS: The American Society of Safety Engineers, established in 1911, is an organization dedicated to the reduction of workplace accidents and deaths through the training and development of high-skilled professionals in safety and health management; and

WHEREAS: The Society has more than 18,000 members in more than 50 countries who will be calling attention to the seriousness and magnitude of this problem through appropriate activities; and

WHEREAS: This endeavor is worthy of our support and cooperation so that we may reduce the toll of workplace injuries and deaths;
