WHEREAS: Hawk watching has become an increasingly popular activity in North America in recent years; and

WHEREAS: We are fortunate to have one of the world's finest hawk migration lookouts, making Minnesota an important state for hawk watching; and

WHEREAS: Wildlife enthusiasts in Minnesota and across the nation enjoy observing the flight of hawks, attractive birds which help to maintain the balance of nature and preserve our environment; and

WHEREAS: Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve in Duluth, is a site that has become a popular mecca for hawk watching enthusiasts in recent years; and

WHEREAS: It also provides model conservation-education programs for people of all ages;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 7 through October 13, 1984, to be

HAWK WATCHING WEEK

in Minnesota.

FURTHER, I urge all citizens to take advantage of the excellent opportunities to observe the beauty of hawks in flight in Minnesota -- one of the finest viewing areas in the world.
