WHEREAS: The people of Minnesota can lay claim to diverse national roots; and

WHEREAS: These diverse national groups have committed to writing their literatures in a variety of languages over the centuries; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota is a recognized leader in the archival and information sciences; and

WHEREAS: The institutions of Minnesota are recognized for their contributions to scholarship and learning; and

WHEREAS: The people of Minnesota have a demonstrated commitment to the preservation of cultural treasures; and

WHEREAS: The Hill Manuscript Library has become the single largest microfilm center of pre-1600 manuscripts;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 1 through October 7, 1984, to be

Hill Manuscript Library Week

in Minnesota in recognition of the singular contributions that this institution on the campus of St. John's University, Collegeville, makes to the State of Minnesota, to the nation and to the world.
