WHEREAS: 1984 is the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Minnesota Trappers Association;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim August 11, 1984, to be


TRAPPERS DAY

FURTHER, I urge citizens to recognize the Association's efforts on behalf of wildlife, the sportsman and the fur industry.


