- WHEREAS: Humanity's achievements in space have enriched the lives of many of our world's citizens; and
- WHEREAS: During the week of July 20, 1984, we celebrate the 15th anniversary of the first landing on the moon, when Americans said, "We came in peace for all mankind"; and
- WHEREAS: The United States Space Program has renewed and excited a sense of pioneering in the American people, giving us a feeling for the sense of adventure that motivated our ancestor's explorations, while providing the sense of achievement and ascendancy that comes from bold success at the new frontier; and
- WHEREAS: The United State Space Program has provided employment opportunities and long-term economic benefits to the people of the United States through the aerospace industry, our institutions of higher learning, and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration; and
- WHEREAS: It is the purposes of the Minnesota Space Week organizers to promote national debates on present and proposed uses and directions of our journeys into space;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of July 15 through July 24, 1984, to be

in Minnesota, and July 20, 1984, to be

S P A C E D A Y

in Minnesota.
