

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Minnesota's community colleges have helped many people realize their potential, further their ambitions and improve their lives; and

During the past twenty years, over half a million Minnesotans have been able to participate in the community college experience, with some completing career training, going on to four-year institutions, or taking courses to improve skills or enrich their lives; and WHEREAS:

The importance of the community college system in Minnesota is indicated by the 15-fold increase in enrollment during the system's twenty-year history; and WHEREAS:

For Minnesotans, the community college system theme -- Knowledge is Power -- is appropriate because it indicates that it is within the power of each individual to shape the future, to set goals and achieve them, to know where to find the resources WHEREAS: needed to succeed, and to create opportunities for themselves and the State of Minnesota; and

Community colleges offer the essential opportunity: to better understand ourselves and the complex world in which we live; and WHEREAS:

As we mark the twentieth anniversary of the creation of the community college system, we should mark its success and recognize the quality of education and training it has provided to innumerable students; WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of August 1 through August 7, 1984, to be

in Minnesota, and wish this system every success in the coming years.
