The Minnesota Literacy Council recruits and trains community volunteers to tutor both native born and refugee adults in basic literacy and language skills; and WHEREAS:

The Minnesota Literacy Council works closely with other groups in Minnesota to provide a wide range of literacy services; and WHEREAS:

We wish to join other national and international groups in celebrating Literacy Day; WHEREAS:

We wish to encourage all citizens of Minnesota to join in the fight against adult illiteracy; WHEREAS:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, September 8, 1984, to be

LITERACY DAY

and the month of September 1984, to be

SECRETARY OF STATE

LITERACY MONTH

in Minnesota.
