



Proclamation

WHEREAS: In Minnesota, 20-30% of the adults lack the basic literacy skills needed to participate fully as workers and citizens; and

WHEREAS: It is essential for economic, social, and personal growth that all citizens of our great state have the opportunity to learn basic reading, writing, and conversational skills imperative for a productive and satisfying life; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Literacy Council recruits and trains community volunteers to tutor both native born and refugee adults in basic literacy and language skills; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Literacy Council works closely with other groups in Minnesota to provide a wide range of literacy services; and

WHEREAS: We wish to join other national and international groups in celebrating Literacy Day; and

WHEREAS: We wish to encourage all citizens of Minnesota to join in the fight against adult illiteracy;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, September 8, 1984, to be

L I T E R A C Y D A Y

and the month of September 1984, to be

L I T E R A C Y M O N T H

in Minnesota.
